## **Rooftop Solar Continues**

Our Engineering and Capital Renewal teams are partnering to install rooftop solar photovoltaic systems on three buildings this summer: the Friends of Rowing Boathouse, Anonymous Hall, and the Indoor Practice Facility.



Combined, these systems will increase Dartmouth's photovoltaic solar generation by 70%.

This represents approximately 3% of the College's purchased electricity.

## Let's Keep Our Campus Safe We can do this!

With 1,000+ graduate students already on campus and approximately 1,750 undergraduate students arriving daily from Sept. 8-14, please remember to follow these most important COVID-19 safety protocols:

1. *Cover your face:* wear cloth face coverings at all times when using or accessing shared or communal spaces at any Dartmouth worksite and also when a minimum of six feet of physical distancing is difficult to maintain.

2. *Maintain physical distance* from others (the recommended six foot distance is approximately two arms' length).

**3.** Follow the latest <u>Travel</u> and <u>Access and Quarantine</u> guidelines. Currently, employees who travel outside the New England states, even for a day, must self-quarantine for 14 days before returning to work. Testing for COVID-19 does not allow a person to be released early from their 14-day quarantine.

4. Don't forget to **take the daily** <u>Temperature</u> <u>Self-Assessment</u> (TSA). It's easy and takes just a few minutes.

We've been doing this for awhile now, and the low COVID numbers in NH and VT show that these protocols are working. Let's keep up the great work and keep ourselves, our loved ones, and our campus safe!
