## Demolition at 27 Lebanon St.

With the Jewel of India restaurant successfully relocated, this 1910 structure is scheduled for demolition starting Monday, Oct. 5. Project Manager



Jason Rouillard reports, "The actual demolition will last most of the week, but after the first two days you won't see a structure anymore. It will take a little time to

remove the stone foundation. Subsequently, new top soil and grass will start along with paving and striping."

While there are no immediate plans for development of this space, Dartmouth will work directly with the Town to propose projects for the site that will help meet strategic goals for the Downtown District and core needs of the College.

## **DOC House Renovations Begin**

Dartmouth's Class of '69 is honoring its 50th reunion by funding refurbishments and capital renewal improvements to the DOC House, built in 1929. The intent of the renovation is

to update systems, make the building fully accessible and improve event space while preserving the building's historical



appearance and maintaining its nastalgic feel.

Most visible to the interior will be conversion of the large kitchen into a separate dining room with a cathedral ceiling and an adjacent patio overlooking the pond. A smaller kitchen will be added in the southeast corner of the building. The lower level will also be updated to more efficiently serve DOC functions and the Ski and Skate Center. The building will reopen in May 2021.
