Opportunities to Give

Campus Services employees have always been generous, whether it's giving of your time and expertise, giving toys for tots, or supporting one another through hard times. This year, there are several opportunities to extend the culture of caring into our community.

1. Give to the [Upper Valley Haven](#) to purchase turkeys: Many of you donate to The Haven the frozen turkeys that are gifted to Campus Services employees each November. Since we're unable to supply turkeys this year, the Haven will miss being regifted ~ 50 turkeys. Donation jars have been set up in McKenzie's Work Control Office and in Admin HR Services in the lower level of '53 Commons for employees to provide funds to the Haven so they can purchase their own turkeys.

2. "Adopt a Senior Citizen": Organized by [The Listen Center](#), this program helps senior citizens fill out a wishlist for warm clothing, socks, gloves, toiletries, slippers, etc. Sponsors purchase one or more items off each wishlist, and the items are given to the seniors in need.
