Energy Upgrade at Thompson

If you've attended a Dartmouth hockey game this season you may have noticed that the lighting and ice hockey surface is much improved due to some recent work by FO&M. Prior to the season's start, the Athletics Grounds crew resurfaced and painted the ice rink, as shown in this [fast-forward video](#).

In addition, a recent lighting retrofit project replaced the rink lights and most other lights in the building with new LED lighting. The lighting project has multiple benefits; at least 20% annual electric energy savings, reduced maintenance costs due to longer lamp life, better lighting quality and performance, and reduced heat from the lights to the ice surface. The project also included a new lighting control system for the rink lights giving DCAD greater controllability than they previously had. Like many other projects, this one required the collaboration of employees in multiple departments. Thanks to Project Manager Joe Roberts, Electrical Shop Supervisor John Biele, Betsy Ricker, and Scott Hening from the Energy Management team, and the Dartmouth College Athletics Department.
