EV Charging Stations

Thanks to Director of Parking & Transportation, Patrick O'Neil for this update. "Our first two Chargepoint level 2 electric vehicle charging stations were activated [this week]. Each charging station has two charging ports. They are located in the Dana Lot and Thompson Lot. There is an hourly charge for use of the EV stations, with users starting a session using the ChargePoint app on a mobile device or by calling the phone number listed on the charging station kiosk. Over the next few months additional charging stations will come online in the new CECS garage, and the Richardson Lot. When that happens, the Dartmouth campus will have a total of 12 parking stalls available for electric vehicle charging."

This clinic will be the last opportunity for eligible individuals to get a booster shot on campus before the Jan. 31 booster requirement deadline. Summit at Juniper Opens Early

There's good news on the housing front, as the graduate student apartment complex called Summit on Juniper is ahead of schedule. Built and managed by Michaels Student Living in partnership with Dartmouth, this complex offers 1-, 2-, 3- and 4-bedroom apartments—638 beds in total—with in-unit laundry facilities, bike storage on each floor, study rooms, a fitness room, and community gathering spaces. Free transportation will be provided by Dartmouth "seven days a week—running from early morning through late night."

As recently reported in a Dartmouth News article, "two of the four buildings [will be] available this spring, nearly five months earlier than anticipated. In the coming weeks, Dartmouth graduate and professional students will have early exclusive access to lease the 481 beds currently available for an Aug. 19, 2022, move-in date."

Because of pandemic-related enrollment irregularities, Dartmouth expects unusually high undergraduate enrollment this spring and for next year. With two of Summit on Juniper's buildings ready for occupancy, these beds will be allocated to upper-level undergraduate students for the spring term, and "one building (157 beds) will be held for anticipated upper-level undergraduate use during the 2022-2023 academic year." It is expected that the three remaining buildings with 481-beds will be more than enough to meet graduate students' needs.
