Catching Up at the Grant

Although they work nearly 150 miles north of Hanover, the foresters at the <u>Second College</u> <u>Grant</u> are doing an awesome job on behalf of Dartmouth. For those who aren't familiar, the Second College Grant is a 27,000 acre township owned by Dartmouth and managed by the College Forester, Kevin Evans. The Grant is widely recognized as a model forest that sustainably balances recreation, education and research, and timber harvesting that provides revenue for student scholarship.

Winter is the best season to cut and haul wood, as the logging trucks move more easily on the frozen roads within the Grant. Kevin reports that they hope to harvest 2,500 cords this winter along Sanderson Brook Road in the northeast corner of the Grant. Although there was significant disruption at local mills due to COVID, the markets are starting to settle down. The Grant's pulp wood is going to make cardboard in the Rumford, ME mill, while saw logs are being hauled to a mills in Quebec and Berlin, NH to make furniture and high-end dowels, drumsticks, and pool cues.

The Grant is also home to the "Adaptive Silviculture for Climate Change" study (<u>adaptivesilvicul-</u> <u>ture.org/</u>) being worked on by 10-12 universities. The study is in year 5 of 20 years with students expected to remeasure plots this year and to produce several research papers as a result. Forestry Technician Riley Patry is involved in a number of mammal studies and uses game cameras located throughout the Grant to track wildlife. Here is a pine marten, porcupine and bobcat.
