Losing a Dartmouth Elm

Sadly, Dartmouth lost the "Russell Sage elm" tree last week, so named because of its location between Russell Sage and Fahey McLane residence halls along Tuck Mall. This particular elm, one of the last remaining century-old elms on campus, was beloved by members of West House who had adopted



the tree as the house community's founding symbol. As mentioned in a recent <u>Dartmouth News</u> <u>article</u>, "FO&M will present West House with the polished crosscut, aka a "cookie," after the tree is dated, and the plan is to display the artifact as part of the house tradition."

FO&M's Grounds crew had been closely monitoring this old elm for years, and set up cables to support some of the larger limbs a decade ago. Assoc. VP of FO&M Tim McNamara said, "We recently did some trimming of this tree to eliminate deadwood, which is the area where the beetle which propagates Dutch Elm disease tends to reside.

Despite our best efforts at removing deadwood, and following a very thorough inspection of the canopy, a large limb broke off last Wednesday night. It appears to have been rotted from the inside." A replacement tree will likely be planted in



the same spot next year.

Thanks to Campus Arborist Scott Melendy and the tree workers for caring for these gentle giants for so many years.
