TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Extends Services to the Campus Connector and adds Mobilty Rides



Mobility Rides – During Fall Term 2023, Transportation Services will be implementing the MOBILI-D shuttle. This is new service will provide rides on campus for students and employees with a short-term or permanent mobility issue.

The van is a fully electric, 2022 Ford E-Transit, 350, ADA Van and will be "wrapped" like other Dartmouth Campus Connector buses.

To set up a ride, participants can reach out to one of the following offices for approval: <u>Dartmouth Health Service</u>, <u>Student Accessibility Services</u>, or the <u>Division of Institutional</u> <u>Diversity and Equity</u>.

Once you are approved for a ride, you can schedule using an app specific to this service.



Campus Connector — From morning to night, we're now providing a level of service that someone coming from more urban environments, who's used to taking public transportation, might expect to find," says Patrick O'Neill, director of transportation services. Expanding Campus Connector bus service has several stops in the core campus with spur service to Summit on Juniper and Sachem Village. When used in conjunction with Upper Valley service provided by Advance Transit, our students, staff, and faculty are able to get dependable rides around campus, commuter service to surrounding communities, and convenient access to shopping centers. 


